Removal of ghost nets from the Baltic Sea

Old fishing gears or their parts, abandoned or lost accidentally by fishermen are a real threat to the organisms living in the Baltic Sea. The research ordered by Institute for European Environmental Policy has proved that the effectiveness of nets left at sea decreases with time from 20% of the usual commercial net capacity after three months, to 6% after 3 years. Together with total allowable catch quota set at maximum sustainable yield this additional 6% of by-catch can cause an important threat to stability of the fish stock. In addition, organisms entangled in the nets at the sea bottom have a negative impact on the marine environment.

Although the problem of ghost nets is common and measures aimed at addressing this problem have been included in many strategic documents, including the Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries, measures aimed at removing the lost fishing gears, remaining at the sea bottom, and thus reducing their negative impact on marine ecosystems are rarely implemented in practice. Ghost nets continue to fish.

In view of the above problem, in 2011, WWF together with fishermen, scientists, divers and other sea users conducted a pilot project financed by Baltic Sea 2020, with a view to work out the methodology for net removal and carry out activities to clean the Polish territorial waters from ghost nets.

We hope that this concluding conference which includes the presentation of the report on the ecological effects of actions aimed at removing ghost nets together with the methodology shall contribute to a better understanding of the threats resulting from lost nets that remain at the sea bottom as well to an exchange of experiences in this context between the Baltic countries.
