

BALTIC SEA REGION STRATEGIC NGO MEETING

A REGIONAL NGO MEETING TO HIGHLIGHT KEY FISHERIES AND MARINE ENVIRONMENT ISSUES OVER THE COMING YEARS AND TO STRENGTHEN NGO COLLABORATION.

The meeting is organised by the Fisheries Secretariat (FISH) and kindly hosted by Sea-U Marint Kunskapscenter

Location: Sea U Marint Kunskapscenter, Malmö, Sweden

Time: 7-8 April, 2014

Purpose of the meeting: To discuss how the role and influence of NGOs on a Baltic regional level is maintained or increased in the existing and new governance structures under the new CFP and EU marine legislation. To share an overview of upcoming issues, including the discard ban, the multispecies management plan, implementation of the MSFD, eel management and aquaculture developments. To jointly prioritize among issues and identify gaps in capacity.

With the reform of the EU Common Fisheries Policy (CFP) coming to an end, we know that there will be increased regionalisation in fisheries management in the future and that in practice decisions will shift from the EU level to a regional level. Implementation has already begun in terms of Baltic Member States outlining the details of the upcoming discard ban, as well as discussions on the new multispecies management plan and Baltic salmon management plan, both demanding a much greater and more informed involvement of the stakeholders participating in the Baltic Sea Regional Advisory Council (BS RAC) and BALTFISH, as well as at the national level. At the same time, implementation of the EU Marine Strategy Framework Directive combining national and EU environmental legislation through regional coordination (HELCOM) is supposed to fully implemented 2015, yet commitment varies considerable among Baltic member states. In 2014, there will also be a review of the EU eel management plan, and we will most likely see the beginning of an extensive expansion of aquaculture activities due to Blue Growth policy and new funding opportunities.

The Baltic NGOs should see this as an opportunity for a stronger influence on the way that our region is governed. These changes also entails that we will face more challenging demands on the regional level than we have in the past emphasising the need to cultivate capacity within the Baltic NGO community on ecosystem based fisheries management.

We hope that the meeting will be a starting point for joint work under the new CFP, and that it will lead to closer collaboration on key issues in the Baltic Sea region and perhaps some joint funding possibilities.
